Fellow redeemed: We grow busy these days, preparing for the celebration of Him who once came into this fallen world to lift and set us free from the accusation of sin and the crushing weight of eternal death. We are busy preparing for Christmas, to remember Jesus' birth.

Yet that is not all, for we are called to prepare too, for the coming of God's only-begotten Son when He returns to us in Glory. And this is the primary focus of Advent. We remember what God has done, but make no mistake about it, ours is not to be a gushy, sentimental focus. No, we are called to lift up our heads and with great hope and joy look to the wondrous things which are yet to be. That is what this hymn "O How Shall I Receive Thee" is all about, and that's what we are going to be talking about this Advent. How shall you meet Jesus, what preparations are fit for you to make? Here we are, not on the Lord's Day, but in the workaday Wednesday world, to consider what sort of things to do that we might have a glad meeting at Christ's returning, for soon, and have no doubt, you *will* see Jesus with your own eyes. Will you be ready, and rightly prepared?

As you look forward to seeing Jesus, you are to take a serious inventory of how it is with you. Aside from mere religious sentimentality, are you in fact finding that you are judging your own worth before God based on what you do? How's that working for you? In the cold light of day do you think that your good behavior and fine thoughts will stand a chance against the sin which always tears at you, infecting those thoughts, and corrupting the intentions and purity of your works? Put in business terms, do you suppose that you could stand an audit of all your thoughts, words, and deeds? Such a prospect, that at the Last Day you are judged as by an accountant who opens the ledger of your whole life that all might see and inspect it and so come to a judgment about you surely is beyond frightening. Oh, the pietist or legalist may say 'Yes, but Jesus has been my copilot, He has lent what I have lacked and made up any difference in my life's balance sheet.' This is blasphemy, to suggest that the person and work of God, who lived in perfect obedience to the Law, and suffered death in your place should somehow be reduced to the position of your second, your copilot, your spiritual handyman. And I dread to think what shall befall the man who would stand before the Judgment Seat of Almighty God and speak such drivel.

No, this is not for you. Your kind thoughts and words, and your good works too, have not merited you a thing toward your eternal salvation and you know it. Rather, these godly behaviors have been the result, and not the cause nor contributions toward your standing in the eyes of the Almighty. You have been made mindful to be good, and have desired to do good as the result of your justification before God, for it is God Himself, the Holy Spirit, working through His Word and the Means of Grace to inspire you and sustain your intentions and works which are pleasing to Him, and you do not for an instant count any of that as your own in any case. For Christ Jesus, God in flesh, has given all that is demanded for your justification, and you stand before God now and on the Last Day too, in His Grace, and not your own work.

So to answer the question posed by the first stanza "O how shall I receive Thee, How welcome thee aright?" In every way, shape, manner and form, not only with high theological delight, but in the down to business manner of the everyday you recognize and delight in the fact that you shall receive and welcome Jesus in His returning aright already in Jesus, that is, in His Grace, in His mercy, in His everlasting righteousness for you. You stand before Jesus and welcome His returning in Jesus, and your life is from Him and to Him and ever and always in Him, His Holiness is your own, and all your good works are a response and joy which results from this everyday divine reality.

How then shall you receive Jesus? As the one for whom He gave His life. How shall you then welcome Jesus aright? As the very one whom He has forgiven, restored, and in whom He delights. You are in Christ Jesus. Your sin is no more. You stand in His sight in His Grace, and claim no other. *IJ'N, Amen.*
