FELLOW REDEEMED: The **third stanza** of our Advent hymn "O How Shall I Receive Thee" sings of our **Lord's great release of the sinner** through Grace.

This release, this Grace that has been given, is in fact **your possession right now.** The critical event which set the stage for this giving of Grace we are preparing to commemorate. Advent is the first part of the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus. Your Lord loved you so much even while you were in your sin that He emptied Himself of the glory and honor which is naturally His and lowered Himself from the heights of heaven to be made man. Jesus was born in the humblest circumstance for your sake. He came in humility to get Himself under the burden of sin and sentence of death which crushes the life out of you, so that He might then raise that hideous burden off of you, and onto Himself. In Jesus' perfect obedience to the Law He perfectly placed Himself into your position, and loving you, died to pay the price of your penalty in sin. In Advent we remember this, as we prepare for Christmas.

But we're **not just commemorating this glorious historical fact** of Jesus' birth. We are also looking forward in joyous anticipation of what is yet to be. The fact of the matter is that you have been granted forgiveness full, free, and unconditional in Christ Jesus, yet your daily condition in this world remains as it has always been. Everything is changed, Jesus is yours, and you are going to live forever with Him; but at the same time tears are not in short supply, and your life continues to be a daily struggle. You are in Christ, and the Gospel is yours. Even so, you are in advent, you are in anticipation of what is yet to be.

"What hast Thou left ungranted To give me glad relief? When soul and body panted In utmost depth of grief. In deepest degradation, Devoid of joy and peace..." Yes, Christ has given you everything, and you live in hope. Nevertheless you still look forward to the promised 'glad relief.' Your soul and body, redeemed though you are, still is panting, the grief you endure at times is quite literally breathtaking, and the limits of endurance are pressed. You are made to suffer indignities in small ways, and sometimes not so small, you know what 'deepest degredation' feels like all too well. You have been granted the grace of Jesus, and nevertheless you are better acquainted with what it feels like to be 'devoid of joy and peace.' You live by grace the redeemed child of God for Jesus' sake, yet you know the bitterness of sin and death in your body and soul daily. You are still in advent... your life is a life too well acquainted with sorrow, and yet you do not live as those who have no hope. You live in advent, in anticipation of what has already been given, which by Grace is your possession, but have not yet seen face to face.

Forgiveness, Life, Salvation all are yours. Jesus has fully paid the penalty of your sin, and you are freed from eternal death. Death itself has become the portal to eternal life. You are baptized, and so you have entered with Jesus into His life, into His death, and as He has risen, and as what goes for Jesus now by Grace goes for you, you are waiting still for your resurrection. Now, and not yet, you live in advent, possession, and yet not fully obtaining what Christ has given, this is how it is for you. You are a child of Paradise, for as Jesus humbled Himself, so He is with you, and is taking you from this life of dying to raise you into His own exaltation. You live in anticipation, having already obtained the promise, and even through tear-stained eyes looking to Him in whom you confidently may already sing that "Thou, my soul's Salvation, Didst come to bring release."

Here is your life. Grace is for you now, and even so, not yet. But hear the words which follow in the next stanza of our hymn:

4. "I lay in fetters groaning, - You come to set me free; I stood, my shame bemoaning, - You come to honor me; A glory You did give me, - A treasure safe on high, That will not fail or leave me - As earthly riches fly."

This is your advent hope, the well-grounded anticipation in which you daily already live. Jesus in fact was born, has lived for you, has died in your place, does keep you by His good Gifts and Spirit now, and soon, so soon, that this present sadness shall be revealed as a fleeting thing not worthy of much remembrance, as eternal joys await you. Jesus loves you. You are forgiven. You are in His life, death, and resurrection made alive. You are going to live forever in such life as your heart cannot yet but dream. Live in advent, dear Christian, for Christ has come for you, and is coming soon to receive you Home. Live hardly being able to stand it in a joyous anticipation of what is yet to be. *IJ'N, Amen.*
