Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me (At the word goodness, put out one hand. At the word mercy, put out the other hand. Bring hands together.)
All the days of my life, (Spread out arms, palms up.)
And I shall dwell in the house of the LORD forever. (Arms over head, Make a tent. At the word forever, put both arms straight up.)

Prescott: If I were more than a simple shepherd, I would have recorded every memory I had that night. But I couldn't either read or write. And perhaps that made it even more amazing that of all the people on earth - Kings, nobles, religious leaders, rabbis - the message came to us on that first Christmas.



The stars shone down on our flocks, bright as a promise.


Mason: He could have come to nobles, who kept their distance from us shepherds, as they traveled into Bethlehem to be counted for Cyrenius's census.

I listed other shepherds: "And *Abel, Rebekah, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Saul.*"

Reece: He could have come at the call of temple priests. But I remember the call of shepherds as we settled our sheep into the sheepfold. Our sheep know our voices. They follow us. We do not drive them, but lead them to quiet streams and green pastures, as **David** sang in the psalms.

He could have come in clouds of holy temple fires.

But I remember our small, bramble fires on the hillside as we warmed ourselves. I pulled my camel-hair cloak around me, lifting the veil against the night wind. My eyes wanted to close. But if I didn't keep watch, wild beasts waited to attack my sheep. I felt my slingshot in my pouch, my rod, and my staff. We guarded our sheep with our lives.

And there was more: "Today, in the town of David, a Saviour has been born to you; He is *Christ the Lord*."

Prescott: Wiser men might have known how to recognize this Savior. But the angel understood our ignorance. "This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in strips of cloth and lying in a manger."
