GREETING Dear family, friends, guests, and in particular you, the family of our departed Melinda Joy Colp... Our deepest Christian sympathies are with you at this time.

INTRODUCTION Whenever anything or **anyone goes away, it leaves a void.** There is an empty space that was once filled. And we **feel** that void in the loss. In this case, that may be a space in the center of a (large) family get-together, organizing and directing traffic. It may be the void or silence created by now the (lack of) a loud voice that can be heard from rooms away. Or it may be the void of what was a helping hand, a daughter, a sister, a mother, a grandmother, an aunt who was there to reach out and help **not only family, but even total** strangers. (THEME) ALL IN GOD'S HAND & IN GOD'S TIME

And when a loved one is taken away from us, leaving a void, not only are we sad for the loss, we may even ask those difficult questions of. *"WHY, Lord?"* and *"WHY, ...NOW?!" "It's NOT the right time." "It's* too early."

Y/Our heads are bowed with grief at the news of losing a dear loved one. Eyes are filled with tears. But we remember that life is not without plan or purpose **and God's plan and time is not always Ours**. God says, "All things work together." God has planned each person's life. As that life unfolds, a beautiful pattern emerges out of that which seemed to be confusion. **All things** – not only the great, but also the trivial – not only the joys, but also the sorrows – are molded by the hands of God into His plan. We may not always see that or understand at the moment, or sometimes even for some time. Taken individually, these experiences may not seem to fit together (to what we think), or may be disappointing, sad, even bitter. But taken together they form a harmonious whole. And God *does* make them work together for good.

Yes, for good, for your benefit. We dare not think only of temporary blessings, or what might seem to be beneficial to us at a particular time. Remember, there are such higher spiritual blessings: a deeper Communion with God, a better understanding of His Will, a strengthening of the faith in the Savior, and a cheerful resignation to the (good and gracious) Will of God. These all have a deep, spiritual value. And often, they shine *most brightly* in the dark valleys of tribulation.

Since we love God **all things work together for our good.** By grace through faith in Jesus and His Resurrection, we have been accepted as God's children and added to the Family of the Lord. Now, we need to learn to place our whole trust in these words and promises of our God that indeed **All things, the happy** *and the sad*, the good and the bad, Work together for good to all them that love God.

And, How can we have reason for joy on an occasion like this?

How can this be? How can we stand at the edge of death and be so confident, so at peace in the midst of our mourning? Well, God has taken care of our biggest (reason for) sorrow: He has wiped away **our sin, and thereby taken away all the "side affects" of that sin, of which Death is a primary one.** Consider this: the true and living God has **paid the price for our sins**. He has taken up our flesh, been born by way of the Virgin into our living death, suffered at our hands, sacrificed Himself upon the cross as the guilt offering in our place, and been raised up again victorious from the dead. He was innocent, **but He died for our guilt.** So that we, who were guilty, are declared innocent, withHis life and death is a substitute for ours.

And, He didn't stop there. Jesus did NOT STAY in the grave. He conquered death for us by **Rising from the Dead!** He took away the sting of death and broke the chains of Hell, which would be our final destiny and destination without the saving work of Jesus Christ.

Jesus' Easter Resurrection proved that our bodies (like Melinda's) will not remain in the grave, but will awaken to Eternal Life. Our body and soul will be **rejoined and we will be awakened in a glorified, perfect body** that can never be affected by sin again, never have any of the sorrows and sadness of this vale of tears and be ready to live in heaven with Jesus forever.

Yes (indeed as God said through **Solomon**) "There IS a time for everything A time for every purpose under Heaven: 4 A time to weep, And a time to laugh; 2 A time to be born, And a time to die; A time to mourn, And a time to be exceedingly joyful;" And, there will be A Time of Eternal Joy and Bliss in the Never-ending "Season" of Heaven's Eternal Joy! Thanks be to God who gives us the Victory through Our Savior and Lord Jesus Christ.
