Fellow redeemed: On a certain day, long ago, two men walking together came to the Jordan River. One of them - the older one (Elijah), took his cloak off. He rolled it up, and struck the water with it. Right in front of them, the water divided to the right and to the left, and the two men walked across on dry ground. It was after they passed through the water that the older one, **Elijah**, said to the younger, **Elisha**, (as we heard in our meditation last Wednesday) *"What can I do for you before I am taken away from you?"* Elisha answered, "Please let a double portion of your spirit be upon me." Elijah answered: "If you see me when I am taken from you, it will be yours."

Elisha **was** there when the chariot and horses of fire came from heaven. Elisha saw Elijah taken away in the whirlwind. He saw Elijah's cloak fall from him. **Elisha tore his own clothes with grief over losing his spiritual father and friend**. But then he took up the cloak Elijah left behind.

Elisha turned and went back... when he came to the river, he took this cloak in his hand. He asked: *"Where now is the LORD, the God of Elijah?"* Now that Elijah is gone, **Will God still be with us(?)** and will there be "a way through the water"?

Our Elijah, St. John the Baptist, has come and gone. We still treasure and benefit from his strong message (from his pointing finger). He came preaching a Baptism of Repentance for the remission of sins. Now that he's come and gone, where will we find the God who sent him? Will we find a way opened for us through the water?

In **2 Kings 2**, Elisha struck the water with that cloak. Again, a way through the water was opened up. In the same way, even though our Elijah, John, has come and gone, we have Someone greater. <u>Jesus is</u> <u>our Elisha</u> Who saves what was lost (not *in water* but) through water.

In **2 Kings 6**, the company of the prophets said to Elisha, "We meet with you in **a place too small** for us." They said, "Let's go to the

Jordan... let us build a place there for us to live." They said to Elisha, "You come with us." And he (Elisha) said, "I will."

They came to the Jordan. **They began to cut down trees**. But as one of them was cutting down a tree by the water, the **head of his axe came off and fell in**. He cried out, *"It was borrowed!"* You and I would probably not think much of losing a tool (or maybe we would!). Even if we lost one that belonged to someone else, we'd be sorry, then go buy another one to replace it. But an axe head made of iron, like this one, was precious in those days. The prophets were poor. They couldn't afford to replace it. The man who lost it would have to work off its value as a bondservant. He "lost his life into slavery," when that iron axe head came off and disappeared into the cold murky darkness of the water.

(It's sad that) We think little of **our condition in sin**. We think little of our transgressions with our **hands**, **mouths and minds**. We do wrong, and we think (**we can**) make it right somehow. We don't realize what a fearful thing it is. **Sin is being lost**. **Sin is cold darkness**. Sin means our lives were forfeit in slavery, and we would never be seen or heard from again. (And worst) Sin means **we are lost to God** - too much for us to pay back; too much for us to ransom. **Psalm 49.8:** *"The ransom for a life is costly, no payment is ever enough."* 

Thank God, **that's just when our Elisha comes**. In **2 Kings**, the man of God asked, *"Where did it fall?"* They showed him the place. **Elisha** cut for himself **a stick**, **a piece of wood**. *What good* could that possibly do?! But he threw the wood at the place where the axe head was lost. The iron axe head floated to the top. He said to the man, *"Lift it out."* And the other prophet reached out his hand and drew it out of the water.

It was more than just a worldly axe head of iron, more than just earthly life that we had lost - we were lost forever and ever. But **Our Elisha came to us where we were**, lost in cold darkness, under the condemnation of God. Our Elisha, Jesus the Lord **came with wood**. He came to our death and condemnation with the wood of the **Cross**. There in His Body took all the guilt and punishment. With His Blood and death He took away all our sins. In Him, we are forgiven. Even though it doesn't seem like it should be so, **we who should sink and be lost forever float easily up to the top**, are drawn out of the water found and restored, washed clean of sin in the water mingled with the Blood of Jesus. We're rescued and given new life.

What joy we have, as we get closer to celebrating the birth of our Elisha - Jesus our Lord, Who came seeking what was lost, and saves us, drawing us out of the **water of Holy Baptism in His Name!** *IJ'N, Amen. SDG*
