ASCENSION Luke 24:44-53 "Our Ascended Lord Blesses Us" 05.13.15 OSL

Our Ascended Lord Blesses Us I. With the truths of his Word (vv. 44–47) II. With the Spirit's power to witness (vv. 47–49) III. With joy in his ascension (vv. 50–53)

Dear fellow redeemed in our Ascended Lord,

Introduction: When I was younger, I lived in Bogota, Colombia, in South America. My father was a WELS missionary down there for a few years in the 80's. If I still lived down there, tomorrow I would be celebrating a national holiday because that's what Ascension Day is in Colombia, as it is in about 18 other countries including but not limited to Austria, Belgium, France, Germany, Norway, and Lichtenstein. In the ancient church, it was one of the three main festivals, along with Christmas and Easter. Sadly, today's world doesn't give it much honor or remembrance, even in those countries where it is a national holiday. But we're gathered here this evening because the Ascension of our Lord does give us great joy. This evening we see that this is because **our ascended Lord blesses us: with the truth of His Word, with the Spirit's power to witness, and with joy in His ascension.**

I. [With the truths of his Word.] Our text begins on Easter evening. When our Savior, died, it seems that nothing could have shocked them more. Now they've heard stories of people seeing Him again but they are confused. Suddenly, Jesus is again with His disciples, and He reminds them of what He has told them so many times. John writes, "He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about Me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms." So He stands among them on Easter evening and shows them that what God has promised, and all of God's Words, are true, and that they are fulfilled in Him!

Really, it should have come as no surprise, right? I mean, these people knew what the Jewish Scriptures said, and furthermore, they had been learning from Jesus for three years! And yet they didn't get it. Why? Well, for the same reason that you and I don't get it on our own. For the same reason that, even after coming to faith, we so often struggle with questions and doubts. And not just about God's Word, but about whether or not He really knows what's best for us and what He's doing. Because we're born with that natural inclination to doubt God and be skeptical of what He says to us. Our eyes and minds need to be open and that's the first way that our ascended Lord blesses us.

John writes, "Then He opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. He told them, "This is what is written: The Christ will suffer and Rise from the dead on the Third Day, and repentance and forgiveness of sins will be preached in His Name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem." "He opened their minds" and opened their eyes, because it's the only way they could see the truth of His Word, and that's just what our ascended Lord has done for us as well. Still just as living as He was on Easter evening and on that Day of Ascension, our Lord still comes to us and opens our eyes. For most of us, He first did it in baptism, but He is continually re-opening our eyes as He comes to us in His Word.

What a blessing! On Ascension we celebrate that we have a God who *is* faithful to His Word. A God who would never lie to us and has always kept His promises. He promised a Savior... and sent Him. It had to be His Son... it was. And so we can have every assurance that everything He says in this book [the Bible] is true. Since He says we are forgiven – we truly are. Since He says that heaven awaits us – it surely does! Everything He has promised has come true and so we know we can trust Him. We can rely on His love, His wisdom, and His power.

II. [With the Spirit's power to witness] But these truths that give us so much hope are not just for us, they are for the world. We are called to be *witnesses* of what we have seen and know by faith. He says, "You are witnesses of these things." And how blessed we are that our Ascended Lord gives us the *privilege* of sharing them with the world. Because in our Lord's ascension, He has removed His visible presence from among us. He's not here on earth in the same visible way anymore. So here's the question? How does He get the Word out? How does He make His presence felt in the world? Through the Word, as we mentioned, which is shared through His *Church*; through *us*. Which gives us great joy!

But can also be a little scary, right? And so hear as our Risen Lord, who is also our Ascended Lord, empowers us. John writes, "I am going to send you what My Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

This was another promise that Jesus had made numerous times throughout His ministry. That He would send them His Holy Spirit. I remember when I sold books door to door my first summer of college, and it is a frightening thing to be talking to people on the spot like that. I had full confidence in the value of the books (they were study guides). I had no reason to fear their reaction. But I did. . What helped was when our student manager would could along and do it with us. They had experience and confidence.

Well that's what we have with the Holy Spirit. We have God Himself going with us, giving us the words to say and the love and wisdom so we *can* represent Him and share with the world the hope that we have. God tells us that His Holy Spirit is the Comforter, Counselor, Advocate, and Guide, among other names. What blessing we have in our ascended Lord that He not only gives us the privilege of serving as His witness, but that He also sends His Spirit to be with us! **III. [With joy in his ascension]** But our ascension joy is not limited to the promises He has fulfilled and the promises He makes us. There is joy in the ascension itself. Which doesn't make complete sense, does it? In general, the departure of a beloved leader brings sorrow and grief to his followers. We think of Socrates, the great philosopher. When he was drinking the poisonous hemlock, he tried to banish the despair of his sorrowful followers but he was unable. Some here might remember Nov. 22, 1963, when President John F. Kennedy was assassinated. For the whole nation, it was devastating. Sorrow and sadness that filled our land. But this evening, we see that upon the departure of the most beloved leader of all-time, our beautiful Savior, we see something different. The departure of Jesus Christ means triumph and joy to His followers. At His Ascension, and still today.

John writes, "When He had led them out to the vicinity of Bethany, He lifted up His hands and blessed them. While He was blessing them, He left them and was taken up into Heaven. Then they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. And they stayed continually at the temple, praising God."

Why did they praise God continuously? It wasn't that they couldn't see Jesus anymore with their eyes. It was because the ascension is the crowning seal of approval placed on Christ's work of redemption. As King **David** writes in **Psalm 110**, Christ now sits at the right hand of the Father and uses His enemies as a footstool. Christ is our Risen, Living King! But not just another earthly king, He is the King of Kings and so, having risen from the dead, He has resumed full use of His divine powers and now rules over all creation. And *that* is what the right hand of God is. Not a physical place on the right side of God; it's a position of power and authority. He is God's "right hand man."

That is who has just lifted up His hands and blessed the disciples, and blessed us! The King who reigns over all creation and **who is coming back one day to take us to be where He is** (John 14:3). The one who is **with us always, to the very end of the age**. Knowing that, there isn't much reason for sorrow, is there?

And so we too are joyful. We too gather regularly, weekly even as our Lord commands us. Why? Because here, gathered with our brothers and sisters in Christ, with whom we are united in heart and mind... here we hear and grow in understanding the truths of His Word. Here we are given strength, courage, and boldness, to go out a share these truths with those around us. And here we celebrate our joy in our Ascended Lord by praising His Holy name with word and song.

Conclusion: What joy we have in our ascended Savior! All of God's promises have been fulfilled, we are saved, and He gives us the privilege of carrying out His mission work in the world. May God bless you this week and throughout life, as we celebrate the joy that we have in our ascended Lord, who continues to bless us! **Amen**.

POSSIBLE Prayer of the Church Ascension Festival in Easter May 13

Let us pray for the whole people of God in Christ Jesus, that those whom the Lord has marked as His own in Baptism and who believe in Him by the power of the Holy Spirit may walk worthy of their calling:

Almighty God, You have established Your Church through Your Son, Jesus Christ, and He has promised that He will remain with His Church forever. Keep us, we pray, from all harm and danger and finish within us Your new creation, that we may faithfully do the good works of Your kingdom, call many to know Jesus Christ by the proclamation of the Gospel and persevere to the end; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Let us pray for all pastors, missionaries and church workers and for those preparing for Your service:

Blessed Lord, You have given us Your Word and promised that Your Word shall not return to You empty but will accomplish Your purpose. Bless our Synod president; ______, our circuit visitor; _____, our pastor(s); and all those in full-time service to Your Church. Bless also those preparing for Your service at our colleges and seminaries. Give them all things needful so that their service may be fruitful, and bless us that we may fulfill our own baptismal calling of worship, witness, intercession and mercy work; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Let us pray for the world, for those who live in fear and terror, for the oppressed, the hungry and all people in their needs:

Gracious Father, Your good and gracious will is ever tried by evil men and evil power. Give to us and to all peoples of the world good and faithful leaders who will pursue paths of justice, protecting the weak and the unborn and using wisely all Your resources for the common good; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Let us pray for those who do not yet know Jesus Christ and for those who have fallen away from the truth, that they may hear the Word of God and believe it:

Mighty Lord, You do not desire the death of the sinner but that all would repent and live. Reclaim those who have fallen into error, renew those who have been absent from Your Word and Table, and rescue those who do not know Your mercy in Christ, that with us they may praise Your goodness and live in joyful response to Your favor; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Let us pray for our faithful use of all God's resources and for our stewardship of all His gifts, that we not squander what He entrusted to our care but use it well and for His glory:

Let us pray for our fellowship, that we may know the comfort of God's presence, rejoice at the triumph of our Lord and His place at the Right Hand of the Father, and be kept holy and blameless to the day of His coming:

Heavenly Father, in the moments of our greatest fears, show forth Your presence that we may not be overcome. Hold forth the promise of Your return that when Christ comes to finish His new creation, we may be found faithful and worthy by His grace. Hear us now as we intercede for others, knowing that our Lord Jesus Christ pleads His blood for us, for all our needs and for a world still living in darkness, even as we pray: **Our Father, who art in heaven... Amen.**
