Isaiah 22:15-25 NIV This is what the Lord, the LORD Almighty, says: "Go, say to this steward, to Shebna, who is in charge of the palace: 16 What are you doing here and who gave you permission to cut out a grave for yourself here, hewing your grave on the height and chiseling your resting place in the rock? 17 "Beware, the LORD is about to take firm hold of you and hurl you away, O you mighty man. 18 He will roll you up tightly like a ball and throw you into a large country. There you will die and there your splendid chariots will remain-- you disgrace to your master's house! 19 I will depose you from your office, and you will be ousted from your position. 20 "In that day I will summon my servant, Eliakim son of Hilkiah. 21 I will clothe him with your robe and fasten your sash around him and hand your authority over to him. Key of David



December 20th

“Key of David” is perhaps the most obscure name for Jesus in the O Antiphons. It comes up in the Old Testament once in Isaiah. Eliakim son of Hilkiah “was over the household” (2 Kings 18:18) of King Hezekiah. Shebna was the secretary. Shebna trusted in himself and the work of his hands – riding around in “glorious chariots” and making a monumental tomb for himself. Eliakim, on the other hand, is not trusting the work of his hands. However, *the people* trust him when they should trust the Lord (verse 24).

Trusting in man, whether oneself or someone else, ends in death. We needed someone to free us from this awful sinful prison. Jesus says, “Fear not, I am the first and the last, and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades” (Revelation 1:17-18). These are “the words of the holy one, the true one, who has the key of David, who opens and no one will shut, who shuts and no one opens” (Revelation 3:7). Jesus has rescued us prisoners from the shadow of death.

Dayspring



December 21st

Zechariah echoed the words of this prophecy when he said of Jesus “the sunrise shall visit us from on high to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace” (Luke 1:78-79).

Jesus says in John 8:12, “I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.” Darkness was over the land as Jesus hung on the cross and it seemed that the shadow death had defeated him. But the darkness of sin and death did not overcome him! (John 1:5). Jesus has risen from the dead, and through the preaching of his Gospel God continues to say “Let there be light” (2 Corinthians 4:6) and enlightens us who sit in darkness and the shadow of death. Now our soul waits for the dawn of the Lord’s second coming more than watchmen for the morning, more than watchmen for the morning (Psalm 130:6).
