

ASCENSION of JESUS Mark 16:14-16 "CELEBRATE ASCENSION" 05.04.16

In the Name of the Lord Jesus who sits at the Right Hand of God the Father, Dear Fellow Redeemed:

INTRODUCTION The last part of the Easter season in sermons, we returned to Jesus' farewell address. The night He instituted His Supper, the night He was betrayed, the night before He was crucified He said "Good Bye" to His followers. His address prepared them and us for the future. He prepared them for His death and His resurrection. He prepared them for that day He removed His visible presence from us. Thursday was Ascension Day.

T.V. and Radio Ministries preach a gospel of prosperity. They claim that by faith, we can life a life of ease in this world. By faith, we can have anything we want. They lie and we listen.

Jesus promised His disciples that night before His excruciating execution, they too would live under a cross. Their lives would be full of struggles and persecution. He promised we too would live under the cross. We would pass through much tribulation before we would come into His Kingdom of glory.

He also promised to take care us under the Cross. He would send His Spirit by means of God's word to call us to faith, to create faith in our hearts and to keep us in the faith. He readied us for life under the cross by empowering prayer. God would take care of us in every way as we follow His footsteps. God will answer all prayers prayed in Jesus' name.

Today we celebrate the ascension. We consider His last words before His removed His visible presence from us. We shall consider this thought as we celebrate His leaving.

WE HAVE JOY AS JESUS ASCENDS.

This is the day of Jesus' triumph. Our Savior runs the universe. Between Easter and Ascension Jesus appeared regularly to His disciples. Our text contains two different events. **Verse 14** probably took place Easter evening after Jesus' walk with the Emmaus disciples. We read:

Later He appeared to the eleven as they sat at the table; and He rebuked their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they did not believe those who had seen Him after He had risen.

Hear Him rebuke their...**unbelief and hardness of heart**. Don't let the significance of this verse escape you. They had been especially selected to be His pupils. They had been with Him throughout His ministry. He had given them private instruction. They had seen the glory of His divinity. And Jesus had to admonish them for their unbelief and hard hearts.

It is a warning. Sin turns us from the truth. We all sin. Not a one of us has a faith as strong as they had. We can't resist the perverting power of sin any better than they. Yet, we let Satan persuade us that we as strong. We are so strong, we think, we don't need to read our Bibles and hear His word. We don't need to join Bible class. We don't need worship regularly. Sin-filled pride turned them from Him to unbelief. He rebuked them.

It was a call to repentance. They had heard Him with their own ears. He promised to rise on the third day. They didn't believe. They hid in fear. When eye-witnesses, told them He had risen they still refused to believe. We are not stronger. We doubt Jesus, His power and promises. He rebuked them.

Witnesses testify and we doubt. Jesus rebuked them...because they did not believe those who had seen Him after He had risen.

With His rebuke He called them back. He calls us back by His word. Jesus is alive. He won. His Easter victory proves God has accepted His entire life as the payment for our salvation.

Jesus has fulfilled God's entire law for us. In Heb, we read: For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin. Heb. 4:15

He was like us except He did no evil. Because of Easter, God considers us to be like Him without sin. Jesus did it for us because we could not. We get the credit for what He did.

He did more. He took our sins. God made Him sin with our sin. The perfect spotless Lamb took on Himself the sins of all people who ever walk this earth. He paid our penalty. We are God's beloved children. **St. Paul** proclaimed: **He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins.** (Colossians 1:13-14)

This Bible truth has many witnesses. Those whose unbelief He rebuked, now proclaim Good News. Jesus lives and we will live. Their witness is filled with His promise: **He who believes and is baptized will be saved.** We hear the words and remember: These words are fact.

The promise is true but hard to believe. As He ascended, Jesus left them with us to hear again and again in order to bolster us in doubt. When Satan points out some particular evil we have committed, we hear the words again. At night, when our minds wander to days past and sins committed, again we hear. When we feel guilty and shameful, we hear them again.

Our hope is based on His promises empower by His Resurrection. Only unbelief can keep us from Him. Jesus said it too: **But he who does not believe will be condemned.**

We will not be condemned. We are God's children because Jesus said so. We have been baptized. God's Spirit created faith in our hearts. We do believe. We will be saved because He promised. They are His last words before He ascended. **He who believes and is baptized will be saved.** We receive the blessings of His work. The gates of hell shall not prevail against us. We are His own. We are His people.

He who "Left" sits at God's Right Hand. He rules all things in heaven and earth. He rules for us. He rules with us. It is so wonderful to know that the

One who rules the universe is the One who went to the cross for us. He sits at the Father's Right Hand. He is in control. And He promised: **He who** believes and is baptized shall be saved.

Jesus gives us the privilege of doing something significant with our lives. Born the least in the kingdom the ascending Lord sents us out with His word. We read in Matthew: "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and Io, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen.

We too are **spokespersons for God**. We proclaim His love. Through His Spirit, He goes with us. He guides and encourages. He gives us opportunity. He provides all we need. So He makes us ready. He rebukes our sin. He calls us to faith. He commissions us to spread the gospel. He promises to be with us to help us in the work and bring it success.

All this is from the One who rules the universe. We read: So then, after the Lord had spoken to them, He was received up into heaven, and sat down at the Right Hand of God. In the presence of witnesses, Jesus went into heaven. He didn't have to go in this extraordinary way. He did it to give us a sign, to give us courage. An angel was there and said: Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven. (Acts 1:11) He will return. There is a deadline. He will return. When He returns, our work will be over and we shall ascend. Jesus told us that this too was a reason He ascended. He said: In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also. (John 14:2-3) His Ascension is His promotion, a reward for a job well done. God has put all things under His feet. The disciples watched this with wonder. They reacted: And they went out and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word through the accompanying signs. St. Luke adds: And they worshiped Him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. (Luke 24:52)

They went out with joy. His death, His Resurrection, His Ascension inspire us. St. Paul urged, (in Colossians 3:1-4): If then you were raised with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God. Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth. For you died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory.

We live with eyes toward heaven. We look to where He ascended knowing we too shall be taken up. We work. We tell. We want others to join us. So, we bring His love to the world. *In (Our Ascended) Jesus' Name,* **Amen.** Soli Deo Gloria!

POSSIBLE Prayer of the Church Ascension Festival in Easter May 13

Let us pray for the whole people of God in Christ Jesus, that those whom the Lord has marked as His own in Baptism and who believe in Him by the power of the Holy Spirit may walk worthy of their calling:

Almighty God, You have established Your Church through Your Son, Jesus Christ, and He has promised that He will remain with His Church forever. Keep us, we pray, from all harm and danger and finish within us Your new creation, that we may faithfully do the good works of Your kingdom, call many to know Jesus Christ by the proclamation of the Gospel and persevere to the end; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Let us pray for all pastors, missionaries and church workers and for those preparing for Your service:

Blessed Lord, You have given us Your Word and promised that Your Word shall not return to You empty but will accomplish Your purpose. Bless our Synod president; ______, our circuit visitor; ______, our pastor(s); and all those in full-time service to Your Church. Bless also those preparing for Your service at our colleges and seminaries. Give them all things needful so that their service may be fruitful, and bless us that we may fulfill our own baptismal calling of worship, witness, intercession and mercy work; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Let us pray for the world, for those who live in fear and terror, for the oppressed, the hungry and all people in their needs:

Gracious Father, Your good and gracious will is ever tried by evil men and evil power. Give to us and to all peoples of the world good and faithful leaders who will pursue paths of justice, protecting the weak and the unborn and using wisely all Your resources for the common good; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Let us pray for those who do not yet know Jesus Christ and for those who have fallen away from the truth, that they may hear the Word of God and believe it:

Mighty Lord, You do not desire the death of the sinner but that all would repent and live. Reclaim those who have fallen into error, renew those who have been absent from Your Word and Table, and rescue those who do not know Your mercy in Christ, that with us they may praise Your goodness and live in joyful response to Your favor; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Let us pray for our faithful use of all God's resources and for our stewardship of all His gifts, that we not squander what He entrusted to our care but use it well and for His glory:

Holy Lord, all things are Yours, and yet, in Your mercy, You place them into our care. Give us Your grace and guidance that all we have been given may honor You and that at the end of the day we may know the peace of a good conscience and rest without fear, knowing that You will not abandon us nor do You seek us any harm; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Let us pray for our fellowship, that we may know the comfort of God's presence, rejoice at the triumph of our Lord and His place at the Right Hand of the Father, and be kept holy and blameless to the day of His coming:

Heavenly Father, in the moments of our greatest fears, show forth Your presence that we may not be overcome. Hold forth the promise of Your return that when Christ comes to finish His new creation, we may be found faithful and worthy by His grace. Hear us now as we intercede for others, knowing that our Lord Jesus Christ pleads His blood for us, for all our needs and for a world still living in darkness, even as we pray: **Our Father, who art in heaven... Amen.**
