Janice Pommeranz Thomas of Plant City, FL passed away Sunday, October 1, 2017 at the H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center in Tampa. She was 51. Blessed be her memory.



Luke 2:29-32 Janice Thomas Funeral "Servant, Depart In Peace" 10.06.17

Dear family and friends of Janice, especially you David and family, grace and peace to you from God our Father and from our Lord, Jesus Christ.

INTRODUCTION Everyone must leave this world. No one can stay here forever. Some depart in a short time and others have a longer life on earth. Compared to the history of the world however, our life spans, when they come to a sudden end, always seem too short.

It is comforting to know that when human beings pass away, they don't simply go off somewhere into a vacuum, nor are they on a journey that begins in death and ends in some kind of completion of goals. These false myths about death, although popular in our world today, are really nothing more than the empty mind-wanderings of hopeless people, folks who don't know where in the world to find hope, so they create their own make believe hope. Janice knew where her **sure and true hope** was.

The truth about death and what happens after death is told us in the written Word of God, the Holy Scriptures. There we are told that when physical death happens, the soul of the departed leaves the body. It goes either to **eternal life** with God or to **eternal death** where it is separated from God. We are also told in the Holy Scriptures that on the Last Day, at the return of our Lord Christ, all bodily remains will rise out of the grave and will be judged by our Lord. Those who in their earthly lives believed in the true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, will be judged righteous on account of the work of Christ in their place. Those who in their earthly lives rejected that message of the Gospel, the good news of the Savior, will be judged guilty on account of their own works of unrighteousness. This is the truth about death, and we know it is the truth because it is what God's Word teaches.

Janice believed what the Holy Scriptures teach concerning death and the afterlife, and so in the midst of our sorrow and grief today, we praise God that we are able to gather together to pay our final respects to one who **departed this life in the Peace that only Christ can bring**. We praise God even in our tears and sorrow, because the soul of our dear sister, **Janice Pommeranz Thomas**, now rests in peace at the **throne of the Lamb of God** Who takes away the sin of the world, and because we know that at the Last Day, when Christ comes again and all his glory is revealed, these earthly remains will rise from the ashes they are today, and they will be judged righteous on account of Christ. **In that moment Janice's joy will be complete**. Everything she believed in her life will come to its fulfillment.

The words of our text this morning were originally spoken by an **old man named Simeon**. He was promised by the Holy Spirit that he would not die until he had seen Christ, the son of the living God. When Jesus was eight days old, his parents Mary and Joseph took him to the Temple as was the custom of the Old Testament Church. Simeon immediately recognized Jesus as the promised Savior and he went to Him, took Him in his arms and said, ""Lord, now You let Your servant depart in peace, According to Your word; 30 For my eyes have seen Your salvation 31 Which You have prepared before the face of all peoples, 32 A light to *lighten* the Gentiles, And the glory of Your people Israel."

Simeon was ready to leave this life in peace because he had seen the fulfillment of the promise of God, that a Savior would come into the world to redeem the world from the bondage of sin. He had literally seen God's Salvation, Jesus, with his own eyes. What he had previously seen through the eyes of faith had now been revealed to his bodily eyes.

In some ways Janice was similar to Simeon. She lived her faithful life in service to the Lord. Although she did not, in her earthly life, get to see Jesus with her physical eyes, she did see him through the eyes of her faith, and she sees Him now. She held the Baby Jesus, God's Salvation, not in her arms like Simeon, but in her heart. She knew that the Savior Who lived in her heart had also lived a perfect life in her place. That for every time she sinned, Christ was sinless for her. That even though she was born with a sinful nature which made her hostile to God, Christ was born with a perfect Divine Nature in total communion with God in her place. She also knew that even though she deserved the punishment of eternal separation from God in hell for her sin, Christ, her Savior, suffered that separation for her! On the Cross Jesus uttered the words, "My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?" so that Janice, in her death, would not have to.

Janice believed in Jesus, into Whose Name she was Baptized, and she returned to her Baptism daily by confessing her sins to God and receiving his forgiveness. Throughout her life she confessed this faith in her Savior, not only with her mouth, but also with her desire to come to meet God where he promised to be, in His Word and in the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, where she gave her service also. Those of you who knew Janice all her life know that she rarely missed the opportunity to be fed by her Savior in his Divine Service. She had a hunger and thirst for the Bread of Life Who said, "He who believes in me has everlasting life."

It is because of this confession of faith which Janice made with her mouth and her life, that we can be sure that her soul is now with the Lord in Heaven in perfect Peace, and that on the Last Day, when Christ returns, her body will be reunited with her soul in perfection. And by the way, there will be no more pain, no cancer, no suffering.

It is sad that Janice has now departed this life, but we must take comfort in the fact that she did not simply depart, but rather she **entered a place far greater than this**. She had **seen the Salvation** which God had prepared before the face of all people, the **Light** that revealed the merciful God to the Gentiles, and the glory of God's people Israel.

And, speaking of "light" (in our text), Jesus was of course the True Light. (But) We are told elsewhere in Scripture (**Ephesians 5:1-2**) "Be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly loved children 2 and live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God. Janice showed herself to be an "imitator" and a shining light of the Jesus and the Gospel. I have said this numerous times in the (last three) years, and many people that encountered Janice during this ordeal expressed the thought of How Janice could go through this still with her shining smile and cheerful demeaner. Both in her faithful service in serving us when ever she possibly could at the organ bench at Our Savior, and in her cheerful perserverance in the sufferings Janice shone her Gospel life and showed her faith, demonstrating that she knew our Good Lord was both watching over her and always has a purpose, especially for his dear children until He brings them home, as He did for Janice.

CONCLUSION Although Janice is gone from us now, by the power of Christ in her life she has left us a tremendous legacy. It is not a legacy of incredible wealth or fame. Instead, it is a legacy that far exceeds any of the wealth or fame that this life offers. Janice has left us with the legacy of her faith. From her confession we learn that it is only through Christ that we can have what she now has, eternal life and the sure hope of the Resurrection. Blessed be her memory. Glory be to the Father & to the Son & to the H.S. as it was in the beginning is now and ever shall be.
