Historic Gospel

The Athanasian Creed and Trinity Sunday

The Athanasian Creed is one of the three "ecumenical" creeds, meaning all Christians should be able to confess these creeds together. The first Lutherans included the Apostles', Nicene, and Athanasian Creeds in the Book of Concord as a sign that, together with all Christians, Lutherans say these creeds as their own confession of faith. At the very least, we confess the Athanasian Creed together in church on Trinity Sunday.

The Athanasian Creed "is different from the other two creeds in that it is not as much an 'I believe' statement of faith as it is an hymnic description of the faith, 'we worship one God …'" (Rev. Dennis Marzolf, *Lutheran Sentinel*, June 2011, p. 3). In this creed, we say that "whoever does not faithfully and firmly believe this [faith] cannot be saved."

Paragraphs 38-39 (out of 40) sometimes trouble Lutherans: "At whose coming all will rise again with their bodies and will give an account of their own works. And they that have done good will enter into life everlasting; and they that have done evil into everlasting fire."

But these words come from Jesus' own words:

John 5:28-29: ²⁸ "Do not marvel at this: for the hour is coming in which all who are in the graves will hear His voice ²⁹ and come forth – those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of condemnation."

Putting them together: Jesus said, **"Those who have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life."** The creed says, "*They that have done good will enter into life everlasting.*" Jesus said, **"Those who have done evil will come forth to the resurrection of condemnation."** The creed says, "*They that have done evil will enter into everlasting fire.*"

If we have questions about this statement that **"those who have done good"** enter into everlasting life in heaven, and **"those who have done evil"** go to "*everlasting fire*" in hell, we bring our questions to <u>Him</u>.

Jesus answers us with His own words in John 3. Jesus says it very clearly in the gospel for Pentecost Monday:

John 3:16: ¹⁶ "Whoever believes in [the only-begotten Son] shall not perish but have everlasting life."

John 3:18: ¹⁸ "He who believes in [the Son] is not condemned; but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God."

Conclusion: In the Athanasian Creed, "they that have done good [who] will enter into life everlasting" are those who repent of their sins and believe in Jesus, and "they that have done evil [who] will enter into everlasting fire" are the unbelievers and the unrepentant.

Today on this special **Trinity Sunday** we use this special (Athanasian) **Creed**:

ATHANASIAN CREED (Confession of Faith) We say in turns, responsively: Pastor: 1. Whosoever will be saved, shall, above all else it hold the (Christian) faith. Congregation: 2. Which Faith, except it be kept whole & undefiled, without doubt, one will perish eternally.

3. And the Christian Faith is this, that we worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity. Cong: 4. Neither confusing the Persons, nor dividing the Substance.

- 5. For there is one Person of the Father, another of the Son, and another of the Holy Spirit.
- 6. But the Godhead of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit is all One, the glory equal, the majesty co-eternal.
- 7. Such as the Father is, such is the Son, and such is the Holy Spirit.
- 8. The Father Uncreated, the Son Uncreated, and the Holy Spirit Uncreated.
- 9. The Father Infinite, the Son Infinite, and the Holy Spirit Infinite.
- 10. The Father Eternal, the Son Eternal, and the Holy Spirit Eternal.
- 11. And yet they are not three eternals. but One Eternal.
- 12. Just as there are not three uncreated, nor three infinites, but One Uncreated, and One Infinite.
- 13. Likewise the Father is Almighty, the Son is Almighty, and the Holy Spirit is Almighty.
- 14. And yet they are not three almighties, but One Almighty.
- 15. So the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God.
- 16. And yet they are not three gods, but One God.
- 17. Likewise the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, and the Holy Spirit is Lord.
- 18. And yet there are not three lords, but One Lord.
- 19. For, as we are compelled by the Christian truth to acknowledge every Person by Himself to be God and Lord, – So are we forbidden by the Christian faith to say there be three gods or three lords. Δ
- MEN: 20. The Father is made of none, neither created, nor begotten.
- WOMEN: 21. The Son is of the Father alone; not made, nor created, but begotten.
- M: 22. The Holy Spirit is of the Father and of the Son; neither made, nor created, nor begotten, but proceeding.
- W: 23. So there is One Father, **not** three fathers; one Son, **not** three sons; One Holy Spirit, not three holy spirits.
- 24. And in this Trinity none is before or after another, none greater or less than another;
- 25. But all three Persons are co-eternal together, and co-equal. So that in all things, as said before, the Unity in Trinity, and the Trinity in Unity is to be worshipped.
- 26. Whoever will be saved, is compelled thus to think of the Holy Trinity.
- 27. Furthermore, it is necessary for everlasting salvation that one also believe faithfully the Incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- 28. For the right Faith is that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is God and Man;
- 29. God, of the substance of the Father, begotten before the worlds;

And Man, of the substance of His mother, born into the world.

30. Perfect God and perfect Man, of a rational soul and human flesh subsisting.

- 31. Equal to the Father as touching His Godhead, and inferior to the Father as touching His Manhood.
- 32. Who, although He is God and Man, yet He is not two, but One Christ.
- 33. One, not by changing of the Godhead into Flesh, but by taking the Manhood into God.
- 34. One indeed, not by confusion of substance, but by one-ness of Person.
- 35. For just as the rational soul and flesh is one Man, so God and Man is One Christ.
- ALL: 36. Who suffered for our salvation, descended into Hell, Rose again the Third Day from the dead.
- 37. He ascended into Heaven, He is seated on the Right Hand of the Father, God Almighty, from there He shall come to judge the living and the dead.
- 38. At whose coming all will rise again with their bodies, and will give an account of their own works.
- 39. And they that have done good shall go into life everlasting, and they that have done evil into everlasting fire.
- 40. This is the universal Christian faith; whoever does not faithfully and firmly believe this, cannot be saved. Amen. \triangle THE HOLY TRINITY

THE ATHANASIAN CREED +

The natural knowledge of God tells us only that there is a god, something that virtually everyone acknowledges, even if it is only a "prime cause" or "nature." We only know the living God, the God who is really there, because he has chosen to reveal Himself through the inspired Word given to Adam and Eve and to their descendants, and then written by the Prophets in the Old Testament and by the Apostles and Evangelists in the New Testament.

Because of the deceit of the devil and of the sinful nature of man, God is continually misrepresented and the faith of people is turned away from the true God. In the Old Testament, God identified Himself as the One who had revealed Himself to the patriarchs, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and as YAWEH, (or Jehovah), I AM. This is the unique name He revealed as His own. Interchangeably with this He revealed Himself also in the Spirit of God, and in the Angel of the Lord. For this reason the first-century Jews who accepted Christ as their Messiah had no difficulty understanding God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Because of the centrality of Christ as God the Son in God's work to save us, early Christians confessed that Jesus is at the same time true man, as well as God with the Father and the Holy Spirit, and yet not three Gods, but One. Jesus Identified himself also with YAWEH, declaring, "Before Abraham was, I AM." At various times false teachers arose who denied different aspects of the reality of God, especially the divinity of Christ. In response, statements of belief called creeds were written to clearly state what God has revealed about Himself in the Bible.

While we grow in our understanding of the God in whom we believe, the important thing is that our faith is in the God who is really there. For that reason to deny what God has said about Himself is to put our faith in something other than the God who is there - a figment of our imagination.

The Athanasian Creed is the most extensive of the three ecumenical or catholic (meaning "universal," accepted by all Christian churches) creeds. Being written after the year 600 (and after many heresies had been refuted) this creed contrasts such false teaching with the truth. This creed accentuates the fact that our faith rests in the God who really did create us, redeem us, and call us to faith through the gospel, and that only such faith is a saving faith. It clearly teaches that faith in any other god leads to damnation.

The Athanasian Creed is traditionally confessed in the divine service on Trinity Sunday, because of its exhaustive expression of the doctrine of the Holy Trinity.

TRINITY-C John 16:12-15 "This Is OUR [TRI-]UNIVERSAL FAITH" 06.14.19 OSL

In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit

UNIVERSAL And the (catholic) universal faith is this: That we worship one God in three Persons and three Persons in one God, neither confusing the Persons nor dividing the substance. (Athanasian Creed)

TRINITY SUNDAY Today is **Holy Trinity Sunday**, the **last** of the festival days. It's day we dust off that venerable **Athanasian Creed**, named after St. Athanasius, the great confessor and defender of the Nicene orthodoxy, who was banished from his own pulpit five times defending the great truth: that God is Three and One at the same time. Three distinct **persons** - the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Yet only one God in **essence**. And there is no other god than this God.

PARADOX The Tri-unity of God is a paradox. A paradox is holding two seemingly contradictory things at once. The word "tri-une" itself is paradoxical. Three yet one, one yet three. **Christianity revels in Paradox**. God is three and one. Jesus Christ is true God and at the same time true man. A justified believer is both sinless and sinner. **It's all Paradox**. In a world that demands a neat and tidy either/or answer for anything, Christianity comes with a Paradox.

GOD SAYS Three Divine Persons, One Divine Being called God. Let's be honest. If we were inventing a god and a religion, we wouldn't go this way. We'd keep things simple and straightforward. Religion is hard enough to market in a secular world. Why make things more difficult than they have to be? The trouble is that we don't make up our ideas of God. **God TELLS us Who He is.**

JESUS SAYS We must take the Tri-Unity of God seriously for this one reason: Jesus revealed it. He's the One Who died and rose from the dead, remember, and so whatever Jesus says, that's it. Jesus is the one who prayed to His Father and yet said, "I and the Father are one." Jesus claimed to be sent by the Father as the only-begotten Son of God, and yet He said that to see and have Him was to see and have the Father. He promised that He and the Father would send the Holy Spirit who would take what He received from the Father and hand it on to Jesus' disciples. He commanded His disciples to make disciples of all the nations by Baptizing them in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them everything He had entrusted to them.

WHY And that's why we have such a thing as **Holy Trinity Sunday** and the three **Creeds** we confess. That's why we bother to rehearse something like the **Athanasian Creed** with all its eternals, and uncreateds and incomprehensibles and threats of hellfire to all who don't believe it. It's because this is the God that Jesus revealed to the world. Three distinct Persons and yet only One undivided God. A (Divine) Paradox.

SPLITTING HAIRS(?) This may all seem like so much **doctrinal hairsplitting** to some. The Athanasian Creed might seem like an exercise in hairsplitting. Doesn't the Bible keep things nice and simple? Is this all really

necessary? Couldn't we "just believe in Jesus" and let it go at that? "Doctrine divides," people say. It's never a healthy sign when the Church, or Baptized believers for that matter, abandon any interest in doctrine and turn to their own spiritual experiences. It's a sign of the church grown lazy and distracted. The Creeds didn't cause divisions, they identified, labeled, and diagnosed the divisions. Doctrinal indifference has never strengthened the church; it always weakens it.

NOW WHAT? So, What do we do with this Paradox of God's Tri-Unity? What does it mean for us beyond the fact that God can't easily be pictured, and the best we can do are circles, triangles and 3-leaf clovers?

FIRST It means that God Himself is never alone, personally speaking. He is in Communion - the Father in Communion with the Son in Communion with the Holy Spirit. When God made man in the beginning, He said, *"Let Us make man in Our Image."* You might say that creation is a Divine "Committee job," a collaboration of the **Father's ideas, the Son's Word, and the Spirit's breath and life**, all working together. And that still doesn't quite catch the fullness of the Paradox. But at the level of our human language, it's the best we can do. It's one reason, I believe, that it was not good for the man to be alone when he was created, and why God separated male and female and made them two separate beings. We are made to be in community and in communion as God Himself is in Communion.

SECOND The doctrine of the Trinity teaches us that it is the Wisdom of God, the Word, that orders everything. In the book of **Proverbs**, **Wisdom takes on a person and speaks**. Wisdom was with God in the beginning, appointed from eternity, from before the creation. Wisdom was the craftsman at God's side, His Right Hand, rejoicing in His whole world, delighting in mankind.

FACE TO FACE In the New Testament we meet God's Wisdom Face to face in the Person of Jesus. He is the Word Incarnate, the Word made Flesh, the Word through Whom all things were made and in Whom all things hold together and have their being. He's called the "First-born" of the creation, the Image of the invisible God, the fullness of God dwelling in human flesh. To know Jesus is to know the ordering Wisdom of the universe in a personal way.

MAGNIFICENTImagine seeing a magnificent building, astructure that commands your attention. It makes you want to know who built it?Who designed it? Take a long, meditative look at your hand. Wiggle eachfinger. Flex each joint. Take note of the muscles and tendons and blood vessels.Notice the shape and size of each finger. How do you think that hand came tobe? By accident? A quirk of nature? Luck? Of course not! It's the Father'sdesign, the Son's execution, the Spirit's life that made your hand and keeps it working.

SO MUCH MORE Jesus told His disciples, *"I have much more to say to you, more than you can now bear."* And those guys spent three years of "quality time" with Jesus. Literally walking and talking and eating with Him. And they still can't bear all that He has to say. And so never think that you've

exhausted everything. You may have **read the Bible a dozen times** all the way through **from Genesis to Revelation** and you still don't know everything there is to know. You may have memorized the **Catechism**, gone to Lutheran schools, studied under the best teachers, have enough degrees to wallpaper a bathroom, but you're still only scratching the surface. Jesus promises more to come. There's **always more with Jesus**, until we finally get the "all", the fullness of what the Father has given to the Son Who gives us by His Spirit.

THIRD The Doctrine of the Trinity **describes our relationship with God**. It's a triune relationship in union with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. That's how it began at our Baptism *"In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."* The **Apostle Paul** says, *"Thanks to Jesus and the justification that came through His death and Resurrection, we now have peace with God through Christ and access through faith."*

ALL 3 (IN 1) God has made peace with the world, with each and every one of you, in the death of Jesus His Son. And trusting that peace, we have access to the Father through His Son. Jesus said, "No one comes to the Father except through Me." And in His death on the Cross, He drew all things to Himself and presented the whole creation to the Father as died for, redeemed. The **disaster of human sin, including the contribution each of us makes**, has been answered in the Blood of Jesus. And now by that Blood, we have access. The Father is accessible. We can **come to Him as dear children coming to their dear Father**, (Father's Day today) **with boldness and confidence**. In Christ, we are part of the family. And God has poured out His Spirit on us, in our Baptism and whenever we hear His Word. The Spirit reveals the love of God to our own hearts, so that we are able to say **"Our Father**."

TRIUNE PRAYER Every prayer is about the Tri-Unity of God. We pray to the Father. We pray through the Son, through His priesthood, His sacrificial death, His Blood. And we pray in the Holy Spirit Who reveals Jesus Christ to us, Who works faith in our hearts, Who delivers our words to the Ear of God.

TRINITY IS LIFE The tri-unity of God is **our life with God**. We are **children of the Heavenly Father**. We are **brothers and sisters** of God's onlybegotten Son, Jesus, our Savior. We have the Holy **Spirit as our Comforter**, our Advocate, our Guide. We are always surrounded by the Three Persons of our One and only God who made us, who saved us, who restores us and makes us holy in Himself.

REAL-LIFE TOO That has **practical consequences** too. This is **NOT some theological abstractions in a book**. We rejoice. We rejoice that we will share in the glory of God, and already do by faith. And we rejoice even in our sufferings. That's right, even in suffering, because God is in the middle of all of it. He made us, He redeemed us, He keeps us going. He's not going to abandon us when things get rough. **He will see us through. Not around, through**. And through whatever it is we're asked to go, whether sickness or persecution or hardship or struggle, the Triune God is at work producing patient endurance, building character, **creating hope in our hearts that will not disappoint**. *To the Triune God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit be the glory*.

As it was in the beginning, is now, and forever shall be. Amen. SDG
