Historic Gospel (Sermon)

Luke 5:1-11 One day as Jesus was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret, with the people crowding around Him and listening to the Word of God, 2 He saw at the water's edge two boats, left there by the fishermen, who were washing their nets. 3 He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little from shore. Then He sat down and taught the people from the boat. 4 When He had finished speaking, He said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." 5 Simon answered, "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything. But because You say so, I will let down the nets." 6 When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break. 7 So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them, and they came and filled both boats so full that they began to sink. 8 When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at Jesus' knees and said, "Go away from me, LORD; I am a sinful man!" 9 For he and all his companions were astonished at the catch of fish they had taken, 10 and so were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, Simon's partners. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Don't be afraid; from now on you will catch men." 11 So they pulled their boats up on shore, left everything and followed Him.

TRINITY-5 (PENT.6/C) Luke 5:1-11 "JESUS CALLS & RESOLVES" 7.21.19 OSL G.O.

PRAYER *Almighty God, Heavenly Father, without whose aid and blessing all our labors are in vain, we humbly ask You, regard Your goodness and our need, and bless us, that in Your name and with firm trust in You we may patiently and cheerfully labor in our various callings, honor Your Word, and evermore praise You; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, ever one God, now and forever. Amen.* (The Lutheran Liturgy, companion altar book for The Lutheran Hymnal, p. 145)

In Christ Jesus, Who calls us to our vocations in this life and richly supplies all that we need to accomplish our tasks to the glory of God and to the welfare of His kingdom, dear fellow redeemed:

Text Excerpts Luke 5: 4 ¶ When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." 5 ¶ Simon answered, "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets." 6 ¶ When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish ... 8 ¶ When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at Jesus' knees and said, "Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man!" ...10 ... Then Jesus said to Simon, "Don't be afraid; from now on you will catch men." 11 So they pulled their boats up on shore, left everything and followed him.

INTRODUCTION When God created man and woman and placed them in His perfectly created world, He called them to their vocations. He said: "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish of the sea and the birds of the air and over every living creature that moves on the ground."

After sin entered God's perfectly created world, God still called us to our various vocations, but they are now all affected by sin. "To the woman He said, 'I will greatly increase your pains in childbearing; with pain you will give birth to children. Your desire will be for your husband, and he will rule over you.' To Adam He said, 'Cursed is the ground because of you; through painful toil you will eat of it all the days of your life. It will produce thorns and thistles for you, and you will eat the plants of the field. By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food until you return to the ground, since from it you were taken; for dust you are and to dust you will return.'"

But even though all of creation, including man and woman's vocations, would be subjected to frustrations, God promised to overcome them all by promising to send His Son to redeem us from all the frustrations caused by sin. Our text is a good example of how this is realized even now in the midst of our many frustrations. So for our encouragement in our daily vocations, let us recognize that

He Who Calls Us to Our Vocations Resolves All Their Frustrations.

I. Perhaps life has been going along pretty well for you lately and this whole notion of frustration in your vocations seems foreign to you, whether you are a "wife or husband, parent or child, teacher or student, employee or employer". But my guess is that you can readily identify with the fishermen in our text. When Jesus came upon the scene, they were cleaning their nets.

And as we find out it was after a long hard night of unsuccessful fishing, but they were nevertheless preparing for the next night's work.

J.C. PROPHET VOCATION Jesus was fulfilling His Vocation as Prophet, proclaiming the Word of God to the people. He called upon Simon Peter to allow Him to preach from his boat a little ways out on the water, so the people could better hear and see Him. Peter obeyed the call of Jesus. When Jesus was done preaching, He told Peter to put out into the deep water and let down their nets for a catch of fish.

We could probably imagine that Peter and his partners were grumbling under their breath saying such things as – *"I want to go home and rest before going out again tonight; why waste time in the deep water where the fish are too deep for our nets! What does this carpenter's Son from Nazareth know about fishing in the Sea of Galilee anyway?"* After registering a minor complaint, Peter says: "But because You say so, I will let down the nets."

So you and I have grumbled and complained about fulfilling the vocations to which our Lord has called us and thought it unreasonable that we carry on with our tasks when it seems so futile. We may have been tempted to walk away from our callings and impose ourselves upon some self-chosen area usurping others while neglecting what God had placed in our hands to do. The frustrations of vocation abound in this sinful and corrupt world especially as our sinful natures become dissatisfied and grow restless.

II. The Lord richly blessed Peter and his partner fishermen with such a great catch of fish that their nets began to break and they needed two boats to hold them all and both of them began to sink under the weight of the great catch. Truly our Lord is "able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think."

RUN TO JC. NOT AWAY Now in witnessing how Jesus resolved their frustrations from the night before with this great catch of fish, Peter realized that His sin was now a great problem. He falls down at Jesus' Knees and says from the terrors of his conscience: "Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man!" Now of course you and I know that instead of telling Jesus to go away on account of our sin, we should run toward Him and embrace Him for He is our Savior from all our sin. However, think of what Peter had just experienced. He had heard Jesus preach. He had challenged Jesus' command to launch out into the deep water to fish in the middle of the day. The hidden sins of the heart would all be known to his Lord God as he dealt with his many frustrations from the previous night to the present blessing.

But Jesus does not go away as Peter was asking nor did He even scold Peter. Instead Jesus changed his vocation. He said to him: "Don't be afraid; from now on you will catch men." And as a result we read: "So they pulled their boats up on shore, left everything and followed Him." After their most successful day as fishermen ever, they left their catch, perhaps to enrich

other fishermen who were finishing the job of cleaning their nets perhaps also after a disappointing night.

RESOLVES FRUSTRATIONS Now do you think Peter, Andrew, James and John left behind all frustrations in their new vocations as Apostles of the Lord Jesus? Of course not, but just as they could count on Jesus, who had called them as fishermen to crown their labors with success in providing them and their families with daily bread, so our Lord who had called them to be fishers of men, would bless their efforts too. But they would have days and nights, weeks and months, perhaps even years and decades of seeming failure, yet the Lord who called them would resolve all their frustrations.

This resolution begins and is grounded in the blessing of forgiveness. Jesus came to take upon Himself all our sins committed in vocation and their punishment. By rising again from the dead, He blesses us in our various vocations so that our work is not in vain. All that we do as Christians has eternity in heaven as its goal, whether it be the mundane tasks of tending to our ill spouse, feeding our children, doing our homework, paying our bills. Our Lord has called us to our vocations and the **Apostle Paul** at the conclusion of the great resurrection chapter in **1 Corinthians** encourages us with these words: "Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain." With our modern technology, perhaps this should be the alarm that awakens us each morning to be renewed in carrying out our daily tasks.

Your pastor should know the very One Who has called him will also resolve all his frustrations in the very same way, overcoming them by the cleansing fountain of the holy precious Blood of His Son. As pastor he has had and will continue to have to endure objections and resistance, unwarranted criticisms, even mockery, setbacks and disappointments in his work, not to mention his own sins like laziness, apathy and anger at times. Yet the Lord promises to crown his many efforts faithfully performed to God's glory and the welfare of His Church. Pray for him every day, just as he is called to do for you.

Neither should you be discouraged by the many difficulties of your vocations, my fellow redeemed. Serve your neighbor in the Name of the One who resolved all your problems upon the Cross. All your sins committed in vocation are forgiven through His shed Blood. All your failures and frustrations are overcome by His great love and work done in your behalf. What you now do in your vocations may seem unnoticed and unappreciated by those you serve – yet the One who has called you is pleased and will accomplish His purpose in what by His strength and calling you are doing in His saving name. **Amen. SDG**
